Upcoming MIRO Activities

Traffic Net, Thursday, December 3rd, 7:00 PM Bob Tykulsker, KM6SO, Net Control

The net will start on the VHF MIRO repeater frequency of 147.160 MHz, positive offset, with a CTCSS tone of 146.2 Hz. The **focus** of the Net will be using the "Load" and "Save" buttons on Winlink forms. This a great method to save "boilerplate" data fields when using Winlink forms.

Our exercise will be organized around the theme of a Christmas/Holiday party. Each participant is urged to prepare an <u>abbreviated WA ICS-213-RR</u> request, **before the Net**,

consisting **ONLY** of boxes 5a through 5e. During the Net, you'll be directed to pass your message to another participant, using voice.

After the Net concludes, each participant will **first** use the "Load WA ICS213 RR data" button at the top center to load the template data for the exercise. That template data will be:

- included with the email that transmits this newsletter
- transmitted using Fldigi at the start of the net
- available on the web here

After loading the saved template data, enter the message that you copied into boxes 5a-5e, post to your Winlink outbox, and transmit to KM6SO@winlink.org, Rtykulsker@gmail.com, plus all other participants.

I'd also like all participants to open the ICS/ICS-213 form, complete boxes 1, 3, and 8 and then use the "Save ICS213 INITIAL Data" button on the bottom of the form. Then please email me your saved, INITIAL data.

As always, all participants should submit ICS-309 logs of the significant activity (checkins, messages, etc.) after the net, either by Winlink to KM6SO or by email to rtykulsker@gmail.com

Emergency Practice Net, Thursday, December 10th, 7:00 PM Mike Post, KI7FIF, Net Control

We will be using a new script requesting check-ins by suffix, not region. The net will start on the VHF MIRO repeater frequency of 147.160 MHz + offset, with a CTCSS tone of 146.2 Hz for business and check-ins. It will then shift to the UHF repeater on frequency 440.150 MHz + offset with a CTCSS tone of 103.5 Hz for a roll call of the participants on the VHF repeater. In the event of a repeater failure, first try the other repeater; if that has failed, shift to the Mercer Island Simplex 147.440.

All participants should submit ICS-309 logs of the significant activity (check-ins, messages, simplex transmissions heard, etc.) after the net, either by Winlink to KM6SO or by email to rtykulsker@gmail.com

The Zoom Link will be operating no later than 6:50 PM so people can get checked in and we can start on time.

Our presentation will concern the use of Echolink for access to our MIRO VHF and UHF repeaters as well as many other repeaters. A new version of VARA-FM has been released. It "break" compatibility with version 3.X, so you'll **have** to upgrade when your favorite RMS gateway upgrades. The latest version of Winlink Express, 1.5.33 will auto-upgrade, but you must download VARA-FM 4.0.X on your own. There are many new features in 4.0 including:

- digipeating
- more robust signal processing claims to work with even BaoFengs
